Dear Parents/Carers,

I hope that you have had a fantastic break and that you are all well rested and ready for another jam-packed year. I would firstly like to introduce myself to you as your child's new class teacher (for some). I look forward to meeting with you at parents' evening. PE

We are very excited to introduce our new PE coach- Commando Joe. He will be delivering lots of fun team and confidencebuilding activities to the children. Each term, the class will be following the journey of a well-known figure (this term it will be Nancy Wake). Year 6 will have PE on a Wednesday morning, and swimming on a Monday afternoon. Please ensure that your child has their PE kit in school for the full week, in case of any timetable changes. Please also note that the children will be outside WHATEVER THE WEATHER! Therefore, as it gets colder and wetter, they will need appropriate clothing; this may mean packing extra pairs of socks/waterproof shoes/gloves/thermals etc.

Homework

This year is going to be very busy for the children, as they prepare for their SATs tests and transition to secondary school. Regular maths, spelling and topic-based homework will be set. Please keep up to date with the children's homework diaries. The children will received revision guides and practise books for both English and Maths in the coming weeks. You will be informed when they have been given these and need to start completing pages for homework. For topic, the children have a choice of homework (listed in their homework diaries). They must produce at least one piece each fortnight and will have the chance to show it at celebration assembly, on a Friday.

Reading at home is essential and comments in the reading diary relating to this are very useful. It is also important that the children become secure in their times table knowledge up to their 12 times table. Regular practise in both reading and times tables at home is crucial.

Water Bottles

Please ensure that your children come to school with a water bottle. As they often spend long periods of time focussing in lessons, it is vital that they remain hydrated.



















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Labelling

Please ensure that all belongings are clearly labelled with your child's full name on them, so that they can be easily returned.

Behaviour Policy

Evergreen will continue to be used as a reward system. The treat will run every fortnight and all children who have earnt their Evergreen will take part.

As well as the Evergreen system, children are able to earn team points, by displaying any positive behaviours in/around school.

Children who stand out as displaying behaviours which are 'above and beyond' school expectations will also be rewarded with certificates in Friday celebration assemblies.

The school behaviour ladder will be followed, so that sanctions are clear and consistent for every child. A child will move down the ladder for each behaviour they display that is not in line with the school policy:

- 1. Reminder of the correct behaviour
- 2. Warning
- 3. Time out/fill in a reflection form and take to Mrs Woolley
- 4. Lose Evergreen and phone home

More serious behaviours, such as swearing/violence will be dealt with at the teacher's discretion and may result in immediate loss of Evergreen/phone calls home.
