# Key Stage Two

As the children are now in Year 3 they have also joined Key Stage Two which means the daily time table is slightly different. The children now have a later morning playtime at 10.55 and then go to dinner ten minutes later at 12.10. There is no afternoon playtime for Key Stage Two. Whilst there is no afternoon play we have incorporated some 'Golden time' into the Year 3 timetable. Golden Time is a reward for good behaviour and remembering the Golden Rules, this is independent choosing time when your child may choose to play outside for example or on the iPads or with a game of their choice. We hope this will help with the transition into Year 3 and also promote the behaviour expected within the school.

# Topic

The Topic this term is 'Predators'. Within the topic we are learning about different plants and animals and the food chain. This will link into science were we will look at 'Animals' including humans. In English we will be looking at Roald

Dahl books continuing the work already started on 'The Twits' and we will start George's Marvellous Medicine, so look out for our own disgusting medicines! Within computing we will start to look at programming.





## <u>Reading</u>

Within Key Stage Two we like the children to become more independent readers and develop a love of reading for pleasure! The



children will be given lots of time in class to read and we try to hear individual readers as much as possible. We encourage the children to read and record what they have read at home and during school time independently (and neatly!) in their reading diaries. The children will be given book review books where they will record their thoughts and brief information about books read. You can support your children with this and also continue to hear them at home as much as possible, discussing new vocabulary and themes within the books. We also have guided reading sessions within class. We have recently signed up to Oxford Owl. # <u>Times Tables</u>

Times tables are an important part of the maths curriculum. Please could you support your child in learning these at home. Your child will be introduced to the Year 3 times table challenge soon. This encourages them to be confident in all times tables by the end of the year.

# <u>PE</u>

PE is on Mondays and Thursday with Mondays being an indoor session and Thursday an outdoor session with Coach Alex. After Christmas the class will be swimming on Monday afternoons. PE kits should be kept in school at all times in case timetables need to

#### <u>Homework</u>

Homework will be set on Fridays to be handed in the following Thursday. This will include weekly spellings and home reading time. There will be a termly project linked to the topic, the children can choose 1 or 2 challenges from the list (to be sent out next week), this is to be handed in during the final week of term, week beginning 17<sup>th</sup> October. There will also be Mathletics/reading express homework set weekly. Children will be given time within class to access these websites too. If you need any passwords for these let us know. Children will bring home a homework book detailing any homework given.

### <u>Twitter</u>

Don't forget to follow @year3lea on twitter. We try to update daily and it is a great way to see what your children have been doing all day. If you have already followed a class before you will be accepted but if you are new to twitter you will need to gain a form from the office to give details of your twitter account.

# <u>Evergreen</u>

We are continuing the Evergreen Reward system across school, with some slight changes. The children will now earn their evergreen. At the end of everyday your child will be given a green leaf to put on their evergreen chart. This is a reward for good behaviour every day.
